Last week, on August 27th, the Howard County Chinese School began its 2023-2024 school year. This marks the 25th year since the HCCS was established and in this quarter century it has taught tens of thousands of students. In an interview with Mrs.Luo, a teacher who has taught at the Chinese School for 8 years, she stated that one of the reasons she comes back every year is because her class truly helps the students further understand their culture which is also something that Ming Li. the chairman of the board of directors expressed was important for Chinese Americans to recognize their identity. Similarly, in an interview with Mrs.Wu, who has taught at the Chinese school for 18 years, she stated that one of her reasons for teaching was to help future generations communicate and understand their families. Additionally, when interviewing a parent, he stated that the Chinese school felt like one big family and that he hopes to do more activities together as a community. In an interview with the principal, Xuan Weng, she mentioned that for its 25th anniversary, the school is trying out new classes for 9-12th graders and planning to increase the number of AP classes in

the spring along with a drama class. A lot of work has gone into this school year so we hope that you have a good one!


